



Alberta-born pianist **Clark Schaufele** enjoys a multi-faceted career, spanning genres beyond classical piano. On both the keyboards and the double bass, he has been involved in many performances, tours, and studio recordings, ranging from classical to jazz to country and folk. As a classical piano educator, he has served as the Head of Piano and Accompaniment at the Regina

He is well sought-after as an adjudicator and clinician, both on the local and national level. Clark presently serves at Mount Allison University as staff pianist. He received his Doctorate in Music (Piano Performance) at the Université de Montréal under the guidance of Canadian pianist and educator, Paul Stewart. He holds additional degrees and diplomas from UdeM, Indiana University Jacobs School of Music, and the Royal Conservatory of Music.
