



Joel Stobbe is a cellist, conductor, and educator based in Langley, BC, known for his engaging musical leadership and commitment to developing young musicians. He earned his Artistic Diploma in Music Performance from the Augsburg Conservatory of Music in Germany, where he studied intensively and performed throughout Europe as both a chamber and orchestral musician. His time in Germany deeply shaped his artistic voice and expanded his perspective on classical music performance and pedagogy.

From 2006 to 2014, Joel served as Principal Cellist of the Vancouver Island Symphony, frequently appearing as a featured soloist and chamber musician. During this period, he also led the Symphony's Noteworthy Kids outreach program, designing innovative educational experiences that brought orchestral music into schools and communities across Vancouver Island.

Joel currently teaches at the Langley Community Music School, where he conducts the senior orchestra, coordinates advanced programs for gifted young musicians, and maintains a thriving private cello studio. Under his direction, ensembles have grown in musical sophistication and have performed a wide range of repertoire. Since 2014, he has also served as the Artistic Director and conductor of the Surrey Youth Orchestra, guiding hundreds of students through large-scale symphonic works and preparing them for post-secondary studies in music.

In addition to his work with youth orchestras, Joel is in regular demand as an adjudicator, clinician, and masterclass instructor, contributing to festivals and summer programs throughout Western Canada.

Joel lives in Langley with his wife and their son and enjoys balancing his musical pursuits with a longstanding passion for classic automotive restoration.
